Chilies are excellent sources of vitamins A, B, C and E with minerals like molybdenum, manganese, folate, potassium, thiamin, and copper. A chili contains seven times more vitamin C than an orange.

Ever since its introduction to India in 1498, chilies have been included in Ayurvedic medicines and used as tonic to **ward off** many diseases. Chilies are good for slimming down as it burns the calorie easily. Chilies stimulate the appetite, help to clear the lungs, and stimulate digestive system.

Chilies have vitamin C and vitamin A containing beta-carotenoids which are powerful antioxidant. These antioxidants destroy free radicals. Usually, these free radicals may travel in the body and cause huge amounts of damage to cells. These free radicals could damage nerve and blood vessel in diabetes.

The antioxidants present in the chili wipe out the free radicals that could build up cholesterol causing major heart diseases such as atherosclerosis.

Chilies have antioxidants that can destroy cholesterol which could cause major disease like atherosclerosis and other heart diseases. Other disease like cataract and arthritis like osteoarthritis and rheumatoid arthritis. It also dilates airway of lungs which reduces asthma and wheezing.

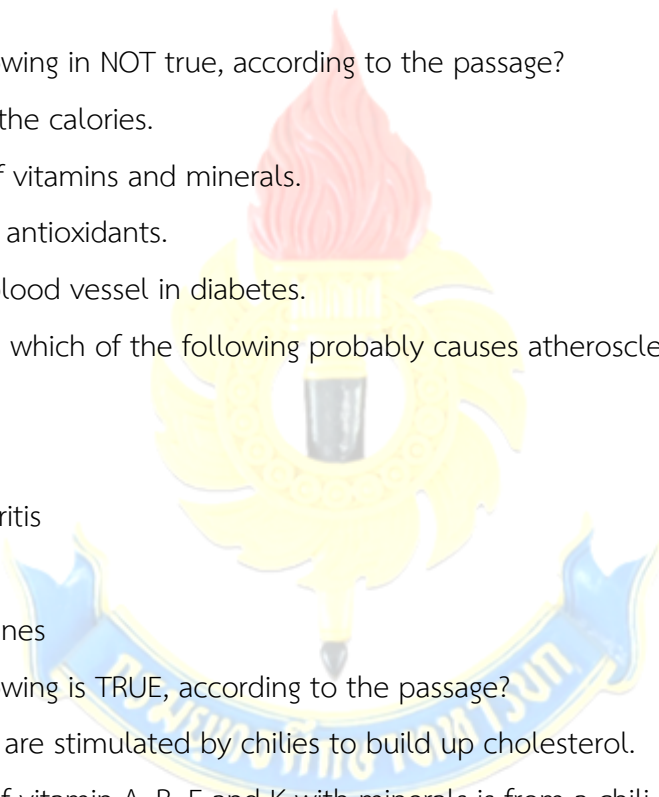

A new study recently published in the Journal of the American Heart Association has given us another solid reason to support one of our favorite snacks. The **wholesome** treat ? Almonds.

During the study, two groups of participants who all had high LDL (bad cholesterol) levels each followed a healthy diet for 12 weeks. During the first six weeks, one group enjoyed a 1.5-ounce portion of almonds for a snack, while the other group ate a carbohydrate-rich muffin for a snack. Aside from the snack, the two groups had the same diet. The groups switched snacks for the second six weeks but again otherwise followed the same **diet**.

Researchers found that when the two groups snacked on the almonds rather than the muffins, they reduced both their LDL and total cholesterol levels. Plus, eating the almonds raised their HDL (good) cholesterol levels, while eating the muffin decreased HDL levels. What's more is that even though overall body weight did not change when participants were snacking on almonds versus muffins, their belly fat and waist circumference went down. And get this: both the muffin and the portion of almonds contained nearly the same number of calories (273 and 253, respectively) and both diets had the same overall number of calories.


This evidence shows strong support for the argument that it's the quality of calories that make for a healthy diet, not just quantity. The fact that almonds are rich in protein, fiber, and vitamin E -nutrients muffins score much lower in-most likely played a role in the results of this study. So next time you reach for a snack, think: nutrient-rich!

The average population density of the world is 47 persons per square mile. Continental densities range from no permanent inhabitants in Antarctica, where the temperature is freezing, to 211 per square mile in Europe. In the western hemisphere, population densities range from about 4 per square mile in Canada to 675 per square mile in Puerto Rico. In Europe the range is from 4 per square mile in Iceland to 831 per square mile in the Netherlands. Within countries there are wide variations of population densities. For example, in Egypt, the average is 55 persons per square mile but 1300 persons inhabit each square mile in settled portions where the land is arable.

High population densities generally occur in regions of developed industrialization, such as the Netherlands, Belgium, and Great Britain, or where lands are intensively used for agriculture, as in Puerto Rico and Java.

Low average population densities are characteristic of most underdeveloped countries. Low density of population is generally associated with a relatively low percentage of cultivated land. This generally results from poor quality lands. It may also be due to natural obstacles to cultivation, such as deserts, mountains, or malaria-infested jungles; to land uses other than cultivation, as in arid and forested land; to primitive methods that limit cultivation; to social and land ownership systems which keep land out of production. In economically advanced countries of low population density, as a rule, large

portions of their populations living in urban areas. Their rural population densities are usually very low. Poorer developed countries of correspondingly low general population density, on the otherhand, often have a concentration of rural population living on arable land, which is as great as therural concentration found in the most densely populated industrial countries.
